Commander's Corner

Since the last meeting, there have been a few notable items. Foremost are developments on the new building. Bids are in, although they are higher than we planned. The total as designed today came in at \$3.6 ml, up from the projected \$3.2 ml. After two meetings with EDIS, we have cut that down to \$3.3 by deleting items, changing specs, and getting discounts. Although we are holding funds that could be used to cover the difference, I want to continue lowering the cost to leave us the reserve money to use for furnishing and operating the facility.

We now have the Veteran Commemorative Flag Fundraiser, and I plan on a name brick fundraiser to be installed on the patio outside the new canteen to keep us mortgage free,*** I also encourage anyone who cares to make donations to the building fund to do so***.

The business end of the Post is under extreme duress with this pandemic, stifling income causing us to use funds already set aside for other facets of the building. The bills create a demand on our savings despite our having already reduced services to lower monthly bills. I still feel the Post should remain open available for use by the members at reduced hours for the time being. I also am delaying the purchase of a smoking lounge, because I think the money earmarked could be put to more vital use paying out bills to help alleviate the chance of having a mortgage.

The DDSB has a COVID Grant that opened in September that I have talked about for "disproportionately" affected Delaware businesses. Originally, we were advised by the Department that we were excluded from applying. Late in September, the State opened it up. I did all the necessary paperwork and submitted during the opening hours. It was evidently correctly done and we just received confirmation we have been awarded a \$15,000 grant to be used for specified debt. It all is under the

DDSB's category of "Occupy Expense" which includes rent, insurance, utilities and such. I intend to go into more detail about our obligation at the next meeting. This is not a fix-all, but it will give the Post some relief.

Post 28 in Oak Orchard hit the news again. They were cited and fined \$1000 for social distance and face mask infractions. Best I can decipher, they had a large event gathering 250 people, which may have kicked on the attention of the State. Either way, I want all of us to be aware of the current requirements concerning masks and the 6 foot rule.

Because of an incident where a member entered the Post and discussed that he was tested positive recently a motion was passed by the membership at our last meeting to deal with that possibility. I add this member also stated that he had guarantined at home for two weeks, but we had no proof of his condition being under control. Now the Post rules are: if you have any symptoms, have contact with anyone positive, or travel out of the country you must A) quarantine for two weeks, OR B)provide to the Post a negative test result. If a member tests positive, it is **MANDATORY** to submit a negative test result to the Post before entering the Post. This is only required to maintain a safe environment for our members and quests. Please adhere to these rules, which have been posted in the canteen and on the entrance door since that meeting.


well as Delaware City Council to add flags to their light poles.


History of Veterans Day

November 11th was officially named Armistice Day

as the hostilities between the Allied nations and Germany went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month in 1918. This was the "War to end all Wars".

While Armistice Day was established to honor veterans of WWI, after WWII and Korea, veterans began petitioning for their day of honor.



In 1968 to ensure federal employees would get three day weekends, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Columbus Day, and Veterans Day was decreed to be celebrated on a Monday. Many states did not agree with regard to Veterans Day and thus was celebrated at differing times. For example, in 1971, it was celebrated on October 25 which led to much confusion.

President Ford, in an effort to end confusion and comply with the wishes of many veterans groups, signed a proclamation in 1975 returning the holiday to its historical significance regardless of the day of the week–November 11. Where it is today!

November Trivia

In 1863, Abraham Lincoln, declared the last Thursday of November to be a National Day of Thanksgiving.

The Latin translation of "novem" is nine, for it was originally the ninth month on the Roman calendar. However, it became the 11th month when the Romans added January and February to start the year.

November begins on the same day of the week as March every year and also February except in leap years.
